General Meeting November 19, 2019 Arthur Norby

Art Norby is both a painter and a sculptor. He will provide a painting demonstration on November 19 and will lead a sculpture workshop January 4, 2020.

Here is what you can expect from his painting demonstration – in his words:

"I like to paint clouds...just clouds, which I will demonstrate (although I am not limited to clouds). I like large canvasses. I approach my paintings as abstract works, beginning with a random color application, then building highlights and shadows until I find a balance of color and composition. I do not use "exotic" colors. I use just blue (Ultramarine, cerulean and cobalt), alizarin crimson, cad red medium and cad red light, cad orange, cad yellow med and light, and titanium white. I mix my colors on the canvas, usually picking up two or three colors at a time and overlapping previous colors in layers of apparent random shapes. After my initial color relationships satisfy me I begin glazing, perhaps applying five or more layers of paint. It is this technique that gives depth and sharpness to my painting. When I include landscape or other foreground subjects I still begin with detailed clouds, in the belief that a great sky demands great foreground."

Open Studio

The Open Studio provides room to work on large pieces, camaraderie, and lively conversation about art and the creative process. Meeting weekly on Monday mornings and Wednesday evenings. AAG members and non-members are welcome to attend.

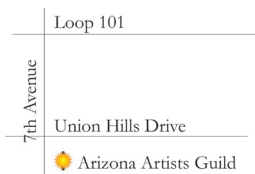

A note from the President, Ivan Halvorson



November reminds me of Norman Rockwell's painting of a turkey being served on a platter. This painting showed us an idealized Thanksgiving dinner. Norman Rockwell demonstrates the power every artist possesses. With his brush he influenced how we see our past, how we perceive our present, and what we aspire to become.

This month's art tip is Mark Carter's Geneva color palette - Cadmium yellow light hue, French Ultramarine Blue and Alizarin Crimson. He shows us how to paint a masterpiece with the three primary colors. Mark Carter has several instructional videos on YouTube that will help us transition from an ordinary artist to a great artist. And they are all free. Check them out.

And if you would like personal instruction from a master artist we have a wild-life painting workshop by Trevor Swanson on December 6, 2019 from 10 AM to 4 PM. Trevor is an absolute master. He will provide an overview of the design and painting process used to create a finished work. I have paid several hundred dollars for a similar workshop at art schools. Be sure to check out the AAG website for examples of his work and details of his workshop.

AAG has several exhibitions coming up. The Winter Exhibition with \$900 in prizes (did that get your attention) and then the Body of Work exhibition in February. Check out the website for details.

Then on December 13, 2019 we have the most exciting event of the year - Artstravaganza. It is open to you and your friends. There will be a full blown glass blowing event where you can make your own glass art piece. Plus David Bradley will have his pottery kiln blazing hot and bright. There you can decorate and glaze your own pottery, have fun, learn a lot, and take home your masterpiece.

Plus there is a critique session so bring along a piece of art to be critiqued. Oh yes, need I mention that we have delicious snacks. It does not get better than that.

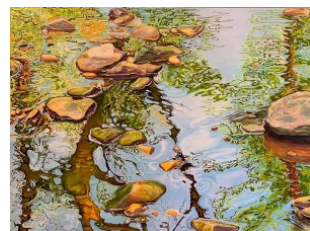

Mark will demonstrate the tools and techniques of stone carving. He will talk about the types of stone for carving, the different types of chisels for hand carving, a demonstration using pneumatic hammers and chisels, and how to polish stone. Participants are able to try their hand at using the tools and carving.

Mark Carroll has been a professional sculptor for over 30 years. He has a Masters Degree in Art Education from SUC Buffalo. After teaching high school art for eight years, he left to make a full-time career as a sculptor and established The Sculpture Studio LLC in East Aurora, NY in 1985. He relocated his studio to Cave Creek, AZ in 2009.

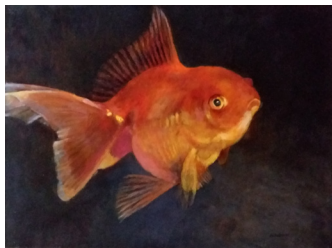

AAG provides free monthly art classes to underserved segments of our community who find an improved quality of life through making art.



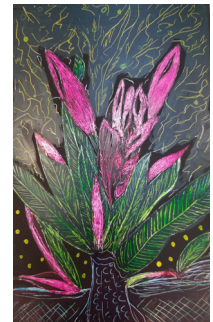

Ann Osgood's Flowers with Precious Metals Painting Workshop in October was exceptionally exciting. Ann supplied a huge assortment of fresh flowers so participants could select and arrange their own bouquet to work from. Painting directly on the canvas without sketching first, the composition was determined using larger brush strokes, gradually decreasing in size as detail was added. Participants were encouraged to convey the emotion their particular flowers inspired through color and design. Backgrounds were added accentuating the negative space to clarify and further define the flowers. Gold leaf was applied as design element adding luminosity. Everyone seemed to enjoy the day spent turning blank canvases into gorgeous floral paintings.
