Studio Lot 14, currently has 4 people working out of the studio, Bobby Zokaites, Melissa Sclafani, Zach Valent and Nick Rascona. It's fairly modest, with mostly yard space centered around a stand alone garage which acts as a common shop for the 4 sculptors.

Bobby Zokaites will talk about his process of 2 major public art projects that will be in various states. He will discuss the creative process and techniques employed to create the monumental work. His work is generally botanically inspired, anthropomorphic steel fabrications – he will demonstrate the metal fabrication of creating his art.

Starting in the 15th century, Japanese monks used gold dust and resin to repair broken ceramics. The resulting pieces not only incorporated unique cracks into the design but also strengthened and added to the beauty of the piece. This art form is often seen as a metaphor for brokenness and healing—that embracing one's brokenness and imperfections can create something unique, beautiful and strong.


