

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Financial update from AAG past-President and past-Treasurer, Tess Mosko Scherer

What a year it has been! I hope this finds you and your family healthy and well. It is that time of year again to review the financial standing of AAG. This may not be your favorite subject, but please take the time to read this.



Quick overview:

Assets:

AAG has four bank accounts:

- Business Checking Account floats about \$25,000. This a solid foundation for us to build from. In recent months

-The Prudent Reserve: \$4990

This account was established as a quick access to cash in the event of an emergency. As homeowners, we all know too well what can go wrong and the necessity of needing access to funds in the event of a crisis.

-Chase Scholarship Fund: \$1150

This account funds the bulk of our scholarship program.

-Papp Account: \$146,000.

This account has been funded by Ruth Magadini and Erin O'Dell through their Estate directives. The funds provide two \$1000 scholarships as well as funds in the event of an emergency. The money cannot be spent on regular operations or expenses.

-The AAG Building

We have no mortgage and due to our 501c3 status, we are exempt from property tax.

Income: Annual income is around \$45,000

Income sources:

Membership \$16,000.

Building Users: averages \$5,000 to \$8,000

Other Sources: Exhibition Fees, Workshop Fees, Art Supply Exchange, Life Drawing, Artstravaganza,

Donations.

Expenses: Annual expenses \$45,000-\$50,000

The Building costs approximately \$25,000 per year to maintain the building.

Operations \$8,000-\$10,000

These are expenses that do not generate income, such as newsletter, technology, office supplies, etc.

Program expenses: varies with each program

Scholarship – AAG awards 10,000 each year to Scholarship recipients

Scholarship funding sources: Papp, AWA \$3000, Linton (private donor) \$1600 with the balance from Artstravaganza, Art Supply Exchange, raffle, the 'tip jar' on the counter and donations from members.

Due to Covid, events have been cancelled, income lost from other organizations who generally pay to meet at AAG. This year, more than ever, we need your financial support.

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What you can do:

Right now membership renewals are down. We have about 151 members renewed from our nearly 400. If nothing else, we are to renew your membership that will provide income and cash flow. If everyone doubled their membership contribution that would provide sufficient funding for the building and scholarship fund with a little left to augment other operational expenses.

If you are happy with AAG, don't keep it a secret – tell your friends and invite them to join.

Take a workshop. We have had two online workshops that were very well received and have a few in person workshops scheduled as well. Check out the workshop info in the newsletter and online.

Enter the exhibitions. Your entry fees cover the costs of the exhibitions with the balance going to operations. This is an important program to support.

Support the Art Supply Exchange by donating your gently used supplies for resale and shop in the store as well.

Direct Donation. Cash, check or credit card are accepted.

Include AAG in your Estate Plans. This is an important prospect. This money would go into the Papp Fund which has been invested conservatively. Growing this fund is an important part of AAG's long range plans. Feel free to call Tess to discuss how the investments are handled and if you want to allocate your bequest in a specific way. — Outreach, Scholarship, Building to name just a few.

Looking ahead:

The AAG building is just over 10 years old. In the future, we will need several big ticket items:

New roof | New air conditioning & heating | Pave the parking lot New interior lighting | Interior painting | Interior floor refinishing

these are just the major expenses we will be facing over the next few years. With careful planning and consideration we can be prepared for these expenses.

It has been an honor to be a part of AAG's leadership team for nearly 10 years. This is the first time that I have had to ask you to donate not just invite you to donate your time or resources. In these unprecedented and uncertain times we need to shore up for the long haul. And we can't do that without you.
